SBA Disaster Recovery Resources



Businesses and homeowners in an area covered by a Presidential Disaster Declaration are eligible for SBA Disaster Loans. Iowans in the following counties affected by the severe storms, tornadoes, and flooding on June 16th and continuing, are eligible for SBA disaster assistance:

- Eligible for Physical Disaster and EIDL Loans: Clay, Emmet, Lyon, Plymouth, Sioux
- Eligible for EIDL Loans Only: Buena Vista, Cherokee, Dickinson, Kossuth, O'Brien, Osceola, Palo Alto, Pocahontas, and Woodbury

SBA Disaster Loans for Businesses and Homeowners



Home Loans up to \$500,000 to replace or repair the primary residence.



Personal Property loans up to **\$100,000.** Renters and homeowners may repair or replace items such as clothing, furniture, cars, and appliances.

Business Physical Disaster Loans up to **\$2 million** for real property, equipment and other business items. Businesses of all sizes and most private nonprofits are eligible.



Economic Injury Disaster Loans up to \$2 million for working capital. Small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, and most private nonprofits are eligible.

Accessing FEMA Disaster Recovery Programs

Step 1: If you have homeowner's or renter's insurance contact your insurer. **Step 2:** Apply for FEMA assistance at <u>www.fema.gov/disaster/4796</u>, by calling 800-621-3362, by downloading the FEMA app, or by visiting a FEMA Disaster Recovery Center.

Accessing FEMA Disaster Recovery Programs

- A current phone number where you can be contacted;
- Your address at the time of the disaster and the address where you are now staying;
- Your Social Security number;
- Description of the damage caused by the disaster including the type of disaster and type of home or vehicle;
- Banking information if you choose to direct deposit; and
- Description of the types of insurance coverage you have.

FEMA Individual and Households Assistance Programs

<u>Household Assistance</u>: Provides up to \$42,500 to make dwellings safe, sanitary, and functional repairs to make a home habitable.

<u>Other Needs Assistance</u>: Provides up to \$42,500 for uninsured, disasterrelated expenses and serious needs such as medical expenses, repair of clothing, household items, educational materials, and more.

<u>Serious Needs Assistance</u>: FEMA may provide up to \$750 for life-saving items including but not limited to water, food, first aid, prescriptions, infant formula, diapers, medical supplies, personal hygiene items, and fuel for transportation.
